Work Experience with the CSIRO

The Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (<u>CSIRO</u>) are Australia's national science research agency. They're using science to solve real issues that affect our communities, economy, and our planet. Their current projects include looking for the first gravitational waves in space, growing gluten-free grains, 3D-printing body parts and pioneering new renewable energy sources.

If you're a high school student with a passion for science or engineering, you could apply for one of their 5-day, work experience programs. You'll get first-hand experience in science and research (science or engineering fields), or with one of their support services. To apply, contact a member of staff directly and if you don't know anyone they suggest that you can search through the staff directory for someone working in a field that interests you. Then contact them directly to see if they are available to host you. Applications usually close in mid-April so start to approach staff in fields you are interested in.
